SPECIAL PROGRAMS & OFFERINGS

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM

The IB Diploma program offers an academically challenging and balanced program of education that prepares students for success in college and beyond. The program is a two-year course of study during Junior and Senior year. The program is internationally recognized as one of the most rigorous courses of study available to pre-university students. CHS offers 14 IB courses for students.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

The Advanced Placement program gives students the chance to tackle college-level work while they're still in high school and earn college credit and placement. CHS offers 18 Advanced Placement courses for students.

COGNIA STEM CERTIFICATION

The AdvanceD STEM accreditation is awarded as a mark of STEM distinction and excellence and only offered to highly effective institutions that prioritize STEM education as a path to success.

CTAE PROGRAM

Career, Technical, and Agriculture Education (CTAE) integrates core academic knowledge with technical and occupational skills to prepare students for post-secondary education and the workforce. CHS offers 13 career pathway course options with multiple internship opportunities for students.

DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM

Dual Enrollment is a program that provides funding for students at eligible high schools to take approved college-level coursework for credit towards both high school and college graduation requirements. CHS offers dual enrollment programs with the University of West Georgia and West Georgia Technical College.

PERFORMANCE LEARNING CENTER

The Performance Learning Center is a non-traditional, computer-based high school setting for students in grades 9-12. Students enroll at the PLC for a variety of reasons which may include seeking early graduation, college dual enrollment opportunities or the recovery of academic credits. The program includes an intense academic component anchored by a rigorous online instructional system and project-based learning.

PROJECT SEARCH

Project SEARCH is a partnership between CHS, UWG, the Georgia Council on Developmental Disabilities, the Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency, and several local businesses that gives students with disabilities an opportunity to develop their workplace skills while continuing their education. Students participate in a year-long internship upon high school graduation.

RA-LIN CONSTRUCTION INTERNSHIP

The Ra-Lin Construction internship is a hands-on program for CHS juniors and seniors. Students learn basic construction skills and receive field site opportunities that provide real world experience in the construction industry.

SOUTHWIRE ENGINEERING ACADEMY

The Southwire Engineering Academy (SWEA) is a cooperative internship program for 12th-grade Carrollton High School STEM program students. Developed by Southwire Company and Carrollton City Schools, SWEA promotes achievement in science, technology, engineering and mathematics while enabling students to apply these disciplines in a real-world manufacturing setting.

SOUTHWIRE 12 FOR LIFE PROGRAM

12 for Life is a cooperative education program supported by Southwire Company helping students gain extra motivation to finish 12 years of school and enjoy better lives. Students receive classroom instruction, onthe-job training, key work/life skills, mentoring, and employment opportunities.
