#### CES ACADEMIES

The Academy program offers enhanced instruction in four different Academy subject areas allowing unique opportunities to engage students on a higher level. Students will benefit from learning the Georgia Standards and being exposed to the diverse experiences within each Academy as the year progresses. The four academies include: STEM, Performing Arts, Citizenship, and Dual Language.

#### STEM PROGRAM

Although STEM is offered as a connections course to all students, STEM learning goes far beyond the STEM classroom. Students will enhance their STEM knowledge in music through STEAM curriculum and will engage in outdoor classroom lessons at Buffalo Creek as part of the Buffalo Creek Restoration Project.

#### CONNECTION OFFERINGS

CES offers multiple elective courses that fall outside of the main core academic subject areas. The following electives are offered to students throughout the school year:

#### 21st CENTURY PROGRAM

The Gifted and Talented Program provides differentiated instruction for the intellectually advanced and creatively gifted student. Gifted services are available for all eligible students identified through a state-approved testing process.

#### FARM TO SCHOOL PROGRAM

The CES Farm to School program brings locally grown foods to the school cafeteria in order to educate children about nutrition and agriculture. Students at CES also grow vegetables in outdoor gardens and indoor hydroponic gardens as part of the STEM curriculum.

## SCHOOL PROFILE

### SPECIAL PROGRAMS & OFFERINGS

#### INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM

The IB Diploma program offers an academically challenging and balanced program of education that prepares students for success in college and beyond. The program is a two-year course of study during Junior and Senior year. The program is internationally recognized as one of the most rigorous courses of study available to pre-university students. CHS offers 14 IB courses for students.

#### ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

The Advanced Placement program gives students the chance to tackle college-level work while they're still in high school and earn college credit and placement. CHS offers 18 Advanced Placement courses for students. During the 2017-2018 school year, 238 students took 376 AP tests with 42% scoring a 3 or higher.

#### Advanced STEM CERTIFIED

The Advanced STEM accreditation is awarded as a mark of STEM distinction and excellence and only offered to highly effective institutions that prioritize STEM education as a path to success.

#### CTAE PROGRAM

Career, Technical, and Agriculture Education (CTAE) integrates core academic knowledge with technical and occupational skills to prepare students for post-secondary education and the workforce. CHS offers 13 career pathway course options with multiple internship opportunities for students.

#### DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM

Dual Enrollment is a program that provides funding for students at eligible high schools to take approved college-level coursework for credit towards both high school and college graduation requirements. CHS offers dual enrollment programs with the University of West Georgia and West Georgia Technical College.

#### PERFORMANCE LEARNING CENTER

The Performance Learning Center is a non-traditional, computer-based high school setting for students in grades 9-12. Students enroll at the PLC for a variety of reasons which may include seeking early graduation, college dual enrollment opportunities or the recovery of academic credits. The program includes an intense academic component anchored by a rigorous online instructional system and project-based learning.

#### PROJECT SEARCH

Project SEARCH is a partnership between CHS, UWG, the Georgia Council on Developmental Disabilities, the Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency, and several local businesses that gives students with disabilities an opportunity to develop their workplace skills while continuing their education. Students participate in a year-long internship upon high school graduation.

#### SOUTHWIRE ENGINEERING ACADEMY

The Southwire Engineering Academy (SWEA) is a cooperative internship program for 12th-grade Carrollton High School STEM program students. Developed by Southwire Company and Carrollton City Schools, SWEA promotes achievement in science, technology, engineering and mathematics while enabling students to apply these disciplines in a real-world manufacturing setting.

#### SOUTHWIRE 12 FOR LIFE PROGRAM

12 for Life is a cooperative education program supported by Southwire Company helping students gain extra motivation to finish 12 years of school and enjoy better lives. By providing students with classroom instruction, on-the-job training, key work/life skills, mentoring, and employment opportunities, they are more likely to stay in school, graduate, and go on to become successful, productive members of the workforce – ensuring those real-world skills translate into real-life success.
